

Re-visiting Gender in Development: Complex Inequalities in Changing Asia

This research project aims to primarily re-visit the concept of gender in a rapidly changing Asia that offers changing economic, political and social conditions in various contexts, in order to offer new pathways for the transformation of gender inequalities in developing contexts. The project allows researchers to critically grapple with new ways of understanding gender in development contexts in an effort to more holistically address the emancipatory and transformative agendas of feminism and development, with a conscious effort at incorporating ways in which gender is understood and produced by people in the rapidly changing Asian region. Fifteen researchers from different Asian and European countries have teamed up to critically examine the concept of gender in light of more specific objectives that address emerging development issues in Asia. In different ways they are addressing issues of equality, rights and development with respect to:

- Environment and Resources
- Gender Development Practice and policies
- Justice and Human Rights
- Gender and Changing Subjectivities
