Renée Andersson, Ethics and Environment Manager at Indiska, and Honorary Doctor at Lund University.

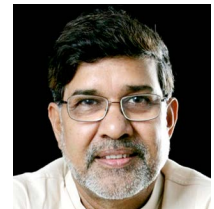

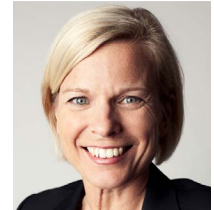
