Paper submissions

- Paper submissions are warmly received all year round via email.
- Include in your email the paper as an attachment, and confirmation that you have obtained the right to quote interviewees, publish pictures, maps and such in a public open source journal.
- For publication in Issue 4 (December 2016) please submit your paper by 5 August 2016.

How to prepare your paper

- All submissions must adhere to the Asia in Focus Style Guide, which can be read in full at <https://asiainfocus.dk/style-guide/>
- The language of the journal is English.
- When submitting your paper for publication, it must have been proofread by a native speaker of English.
- Paper length is 3500 words (+/- 350 words), excluding abstract, title, photos, graphs and references.
- The paper should be prepared and submitted in MS-Word compatible software.
- For references use parenthetical in-text APA style.
- Do not include any endnotes or footnotes.
- Please state whether the submission should be considered an academic article or an academic essay.
- A concise abstract of no more than 200 words is required upon submission.
- Provide a maximum of six keywords. The reader should get a strong impression of the main ideas discussed in your piece from this short list.
- Please include a short biography. Include information about your affiliated institution, your academic degree, and your primary research interests.
- Please state whether we may publish your email address or other contact information.
